



#### **Principal Rhetorical and Literary Devices**

1. **Alliteration**: repetition of the same letter at beginning of words or syllables: *Marcus me momordit.* 

- 2. Anaphora: the repetition of a word or phrase for emphasis: *non feram, non sinam, non patiar*
- 3. **Anastrophe**: inversion of usual word order (e.g., preposit governs): *te propter vivo* (instead of the expected *propter te vivo*)
- 4. Aposiopesis: breaking off in the middle of a sentence : quem ego . . . sed non possum pergere. ("Whom I . . . but I car
- 5. Apostrophe: addressing a person who is not present: *O maiores, quid diceretis de hac re?* ("Oh ancestors, what wo matter?")
- 6. Asyndeton: omission of conjunctions: *videt, sentit, scit.*
- 7. Chiasmus: "a-b-b-a" arrangement of words: magnas urbes oppida parva (adjective, noun, noun, adjective
- 8. Ellipsis: omission of words: Dixit me inventum. ("He said I had been found." esse is miss



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#### Seeing the World Through the Other's Eye: An Online Intervention Reducing Ethnic Prejudice

Perform the results of an intervention that targeted anti-Roma sentiment in Hungary using an online perspective-taking game. We evaluated the impact of this intervention using a randomized experiment in which a sample of young adults played this perspective-taking game, or an unrelated online game. Participation in the perspective-taking game markedly reduced prejudice, with an effect-size equivalent to half the difference between voters of the far-right and the center-right party. The effects persisted for at least a month, and, as a byproduct, the intervention also reduced antipathy toward refugees, another stigmatized group in Hungary, and decreased vote intentions for Hungary's overtly racist, far-right party by 10%. Our study offers a proof-of-concept for a general class of interventions that could be adapted to different settings and implemented at low costs.




